<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Does not provide an example of what the character does next. - Epilogue is a retelling of the story rather than a continuation of the story. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Epilogue contains one or two examples of what the character might do in the future. - The events the epilogue describes do not reflect the ways the character was changing in the story. - The epilogue is shorter than a paragraph. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Epilogue describes a few examples of how the character acts in the future and how things play out for the character. - The events described in the epilogue are influenced by what happened to the character in the story and how the character changed by the end. - The epilogue is longer than a paragraph (or 7 sentences). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The epilogue contains everything in Level 3 in addition to the following: - The writing in the epilogue demonstrates qualities of personal narrative writing (i.e. descriptive language, dialogue, action, etc.) - The epilogue is includes realistic problems the character continues to face.
