For items checked *yes*, write evidence of how the characteristic was present in the story in the far right column. For items checked *no*, write a suggestion of how the story could address the characteristic.

Concrete details are used to describe the way the main character looks and speaks.			
Supporting characters are named or identified.			
Concrete details are used to describe the way the supporting characters look and speak.			

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Setting	Yes	No	Evidence or Suggestion
The location of the story is clear.			
The time period in which the story takes place is clear.			

Conflict	Yes	No	Evidence or Suggestion
Is a character clearly established as the protagonist?			
Is a character clearly established as an antagonist?			

Resolution	Yes	No	Evidence or Suggestion
The resolution solves the same conflict that is presented earlier in the story.			
The resolution is believable.
