## Guidelines for Participating in a Seminar

- 1. Form a circle so people are facing one another.
- 2. Be prepared with reading and questions completed.
- 3. Be courteous—there will be no put-downs and no sarcasm.
- 4. Allow everyone enough time to finish his or her thoughts—do not interrupt.
- 5. Speak up when no one else is talking. There should be no need to raise hands.
- 6. Be an active listener. If it helps you focus, take notes.
- 7. Have your book open and use it to share evidence to support your opinions.
