Question Type	Description	Examples
Opening Questions	These are questions anyone can answer; knowing the text allows you to ask the question, but you don't to have read to answer.	
Closed-ended Questions	The purpose of these questions is to find out what the text says; there is really only one answer to them.	
Open-ended Questions	There are many possible responses to these questions; there is no "right" answer. You need evidence (probably from the text) to help answer these questions.	
Core Questions	These questions help you explore the "big ideas"—themes, main ideas, and essential issues—of the work.
