Summary & Critique Tips

Writing a <u>Summary</u>:

- Concentrate on creating a brief review of the changes made to the myth of Hercules. Do not ramble.
- Avoid adding your own opinion or ideas; stick to facts that are unquestionable.
- Spend time discussing elements of the plot that were true of both versions of the story as well as elements that differed.
- Speak in the third-person; the word "I" should not appear in your summary.

Writing a <u>Critique</u>:

- This is your chance to share your opinions about Disney's changes; avoid simply repeating your summary.
- Instead of stating what you "liked" or "disliked," try to focus on whether changes were effective or necessary. Use stems such as:
 - "It was really effective when...."
 - "It took away from the story when..."
 - "A necessary change was..."
 - "An unnecessary change was...."
 - "The unique Disney audience requred...."
 - "Disney's purpose required them to change..."
- Each of your opinions should be supported with evidence and critical thinking. Audience and purpose should be addressed.
- Continue speaking in third person; the word "I" should be used sparingly if at all.
