	 thesis, your opinion of the cultural relevance of the text
BODY PARAGRAPHS	The body paragraphs generally include
PARAGRAPHS	 a brief summary of the text
	 For fiction: details on characters, setting, and plot. For nonfiction: explanation of the main points.
	 very concrete material that supports your opinion of the cultural relevance of the text, including these areas:
	 characters experiences/events setting (place and time) age and gender of main character(s)
CONCLUSION	 The conclusion should review the main points you have made. leave the reader with a clear and memorable impression of the text you have reviewed.
