Tips for a Successful Cross-Age Buddy Program

- Successful cross-age buddy literacy programs require cooperation between all parties. Make sure that all students and teachers are prepared and understand the desired outcome.
- 2. When you are pairing students, try to choose partners with common interests. Same-gender pairs are often most successful, especially for young children.



- 3. Make sure you have a large enough space for the buddies to comfortably work and that you have an adequate number of computers and other materials.
- 4. Prior to beginning a buddy computer experience, give the big buddies training on the computer program(s) they will use.
- 5. Each teacher should spend time establishing rules and requirements of the program. You might want to hold a collective brainstorming session with all students to create a list of procedures.
- 6. Prior to the first buddy session, each teacher should spend time with his or her students going over the agreed-upon procedures. Ask students to share any concerns. Provide some possible scenarios and have students contribute solutions. For example, you could ask,
 - What would you do if your buddy took over and wouldn't let you have a turn?
 - What would you do if you felt shy with your buddy?
 - What would you do if your buddy didn't talk to you?
 - What would you do if you were unsure of how to ask your buddy a question?
