Visual Footage and Text

The following points refer to the use of narration and/or captioning in film.

- 1. Text and visuals are related but do not need to be exactly the same.
- 2. The text should be readable without the visual images and still be well written.
- 3. Visual images can be choppy in a montage. The text actually ties them together.
- 4. Text should remain on screen long enough to be easily read.
- 5. The visual can provide specific examples of a concept; the text then does not have to name the examples. Or the visual can give a general picture while the text offers a specific example or fact.
- 6. The text can give necessary but perhaps boring details while the visual shows engaging footage.
