## "Choose Something Like a Star" Discussion Questions

Though by no means an exhaustive guide to "Choose Something Like a Star," these questions can help focus readers on important issues that will support language study.

- 1. What does the speaker want from the star? How does the speaker react to the star's response?
- 2. What can readers infer about the identity of the speaker? What traits does the speaker seem to possess? Who is the "we" of the poem?
- 3. What does the star ask of "us?"
- 4. "Keats' Eremite" is a reference to the steadfast star in John Keats' poem "Bright Star," in which a star watches eternally the changeable activity on earth: the tide, snowfall, human love. What might the star signify symbolically?
- 5. Characterize the language of the poem. Formal or informal? Casual or planned and thought out? Reserved or passionate?
