## Assessment Criteria: Read Aloud

During read-aloud sessions:

- Do students contribute examples that relate to the pictures?
- Do students note numerical relationships?
- Among sets (e.g. "Four wheels can be 2 and $2^{\prime \prime}$ )
- Between skip counting and addition (e.g. "You can say $2+2=4$ ", or "2 $+2+2=6 ")$
- Between addition and multiplication (older students) (e.g. "You can say 3 plus 3 is 6 , or you can say 2 threes are 6)
- About odd and even numbers (e.g. "We keep getting even numbers when we add sets of eyes;" or "One tricycle is 3 wheels, that's odd; but 2 tricycles have 6 wheels, that's even."
