Reading Display Requirements

Use words and graphics in your display.

- Print words in large, bold type that is easy to read.
- Include appropriate symbols or illustrations

There is a balance between text and graphics (illustrations, symbols).

 Too many graphics without explanation can create the same confusion as too many text blocks without graphics.

The words are easy to read and spelled correctly.

Layout of the display effectively pays attention to:

- the position of the text.
- the use of color.
- the use of illustrations.
- the use of symbols.

The display is appealing and interesting enough to encourage others to read the text or to learn more about the author or genre.

The display looks neat and uses white space well.

 The graphics and text should be evenly distributed around the display.

The display meets the criteria of the rubric.
