Teacher: The word is anticipate. It is four syllables. An-tic-i-pate

Repeat it with me syllable by syllable. An-tic-i-pate

Students: An-tic-i-pate

Teacher: Let's blend it together. Anticipate.

Students: Anticipate.

Teacher: Anticipate is a verb. It is an action you do. It is when you

expect something to happen. For example, on my birthday I expect my best friend to give me a present. A present from

my friends on my birthday is something I . . . .

Students: Anticipate.

Teacher: If I never study and never turn in my class work, I don't

expect a passing grade. If I don't study or do the work, a

failing grade is something that I might . . .

Students: Anticipate.

Teacher: In your student dictionary, please write down how you

would explain the word anticipate. Then write an example

of anticipate. We will share a few.

Students write definitions and descriptions of *anticipate*. Some can be shared at teacher's discretion.

Teacher: This is a sketch or symbol to help me think about what

anticipate means. (Teacher sketches a face with a thought bubble on top or some other nonlinguistic representation of the word anticipate.) Now you draw an image or symbol to

represent anticipate.

Students draw images to represent anticipate. Sharing is optional.
